Oregon Membership Update

Last year Oregon came in 5th in the nation for membership gain and we are well on our way to achieving a second straight year of membership growth. As an organization it has been 43 years since the Elks have had two consecutive years of growth and thanks to the efforts of Oregon Elks and Elks across the country promoting Elkdom with enthusiasm we are well on our way to making history. There are two key things to keep in mind in regard to our membership efforts *initiation* and *delinquents*.

We currently have 438 candidates awaiting initiation into our order. We have two months left in the year to make sure we are getting all of those outstanding candidates initiated plus any additional that submit applications. And if candidates are not able to make your regular lodge initiation you do have several options available to you in order to make sure these candidates get initiated into our order. First, you can hold a special meeting for the purpose of initiation. This meeting could be held on a weekend or even a weekday afternoon. And if your elected officers are not all able to participate you can have a team of PER's conduct the initiation for you as well. Another option is to talk to neighboring lodges to see if their initiation nights work better for your candidate. The candidate will still be a member of your lodge even if a neighboring lodge conducts their initiation ritual. If we can initiate all of our current candidates, we have a projected gain of 382 new members for the year. And again, we still have two months left to add even more to that number.

We also have 1,621 delinguent members. In late January the OSEA membership team sent emails and text messages to delinguent members encouraging them to renew their dues. Those efforts led to nearly 100 delinquent members being removed from the delinquent list. This proves that if we take the time and put in the effort to reach out to delinguent members, we can get them to renew. When reaching out to these delinguent members, if they don't want to renew it is important to find out why especially if it is due to a financial or medical hardship. This is especially common among older members, many of whom have been members of our order for decades. Over eighty of our current delinguent members hold life member status. Our lodges do an incredible amount of charity work in our communities, but don't forget that charity starts at home. If you have long time members or life members who are not able to renew due to health or financial

hardship give them a hardship consideration. They have given decades of loyal membership to our order, making sure we maintain their membership when there are not able to is the least we can do in return.

Oregon is well positioned for another gain this year. In January we exceeded our new member goal by bringing in more than 2500 new members in Oregon. Let's keep out foot on the gas and end the year with a strong membership gain.

We as Elks try to exemplify the word service in our local communities every day. Two of our cardinal principles, Charity and Brotherly Love, reflect this and are part of the very foundation on which our Order is built. The Grand Lodge also promotes, in our Local Lodges, many programs to recognize service, including the Medal of Service and the Medal of Valor programs.

For a small fee, your Lodge Secretary can order both Medals of Service and Valor. The Service medals are to be awarded to local EMS, fire fighting, and law enforcement representatives deemed worthy by your membership, for exemplary service in the performance of their work. While I pray your Lodge never has the need to award a Medal of Valor, it is intended to be given to the families of those same first responders who have lost their lives in the performance of their duties.

If your Lodge is not currently participating in this program, I strongly encourage you to begin as soon as possible. It is a simple, low-cost program that provides a high impact appreciation for your membership and our entire Order.

Betty Hise for Cancer Research

Betty Hise for Cancer Research is proudly celebrating 35 years of dedication to fundraising in support of Cancer Research! We are pleased to report the grand total donated is at \$678,264 and counting!

Each year we choose one program in each of Oregon and Idaho as recipients of our funds.

The chosen program in Oregon is named Ovarian Cancer Research, led by Tanja Pejovic, M.D., Ph., K. at the OHSU Knight Cancer Institute. The program's focus is ovarian cancer with brain metastases. As the treatment of ovarian cancer has improved and the survival is longer, the incidence of brain metastases and the treatment has become a challenge. Unfortunately, effective treatment is currently not available. OHSU has recently paired with six academic centers that are working together in this research and are referred to as the Ovarian Cancer Brain Metastases Consortium. More on this program as we learn more!

St Luke's Cancer Institute in Idaho program is named Breast Cancer Research – ADEPT whose goals were highlighted in December's issue of the OSEA newsletter. Again, more on this study as we learn more.
