The State Association Officers are investigating whether Oregon should redistrict ourselves as we have several indicators that point towards needing such a necessary change. I am appointing a small committee to examine the possibilities, and come up with a plan as there are many hurdles to contend with. Our State infrastructure is changing, and certainly a change in our District "Map" merits serious consideration. Initially, we are considering going from 7 Districts to 5, but that of course is up to the committee to provide recommendations for necessary Bylaw changes. If the decision is to move forward with redistricting, our goal is to have the changes be available for vote by the delegates at next year's Summer Convention in Seaside in April. Last month the OSEA Public Relations and Marketing Committee put out our first press release for the year to celebrate the news that Oregon lodges came in 5th in the nation for charitable giving among Elks lodges with over \$9.3 million donated last year. Between newspapers and social media nearly 52,000 people in Oregon saw our headline and had the chance to read about the incredible work done by your lodges. On social media alone we had over 1400 individuals reached, 22 shares, 101 reactions, and 54 people further viewed our page to learn more about us. But this is just a start, we need to make sure that we are continuing to spread the word about our lodges and the great things we are doing to serve our communities every day. We need to take pride in those things and share that pride with others. So, we are asking you to help us spread the word even further. A first time Bunco Night was attended by a lively group of participants. There was also a Spring Craft Fair, which was a fantastic opportunity to showcase our lodge. The Shooting Range is back in operation and the members have been busy cleaning up and doing updates as needed. The lodge is proud to announce that one of their

Scholarship winners, Caleb Matthews of Philomath HS, advanced to Nationals and was awarded a \$20,000 Elks National Foundation scholarship.

Bylaw Amendments

All 28 bylaw amendments passed by a vast majority of votes.

- Fall Seminar can now be a business meeting if needed. It will stay mainly as a training seminar.
- New lodges will no longer pay a sliding scale on dues.
 They will pay the same as all lodges.
- The Assistant Tiler and Organist were added as OSEA Appointed Officers.
- The ritual team from the year previous to Grand Lodge Convention will now be the team competing at the National competition (This year's officers will be the ones competing at the district and state competitions). This brings us into alignment with the rest of the nation.
- The Elks Veterans Service Committee will now be known as the Oregon Elks Veterans Committee.
- Elks Youth Eye Service (EYES) was designated as our Major State Project. EYES will now support our Visual Program and the programs being conducted by the Oregon Elks Children's Eye Clinic.
