Do you donate to the Elks National Foundation often? Did you know there's a club for members who donate monthly called the Fidelity Club? The ENF Fidelity Club recognizes giving via automatic, regularly scheduled payments. Sustaining givers have a recurring monthly payment (minimum \$5) that is automatically debited from a bank account or charged to a credit card. Monthly giving is safe, reliable, and allows the ENF to spend less time on administration and more time on our charitable mission. Not to mention, members receive Fidelity Club stickers, pins, and pin attachments depending on their level of giving. To sign up Visit enf.elks.org/recurring to enroll today. In addition to encouraging your members to join the ENF Fidelity Club, we would like to encourage all lodges to take advantage of the ENF Community Investment Program Grants for your charitable projects.

Beacon Grants

Through Beacon Grants, the Elks National Foundation gives Lodges the opportunity to develop an ongoing, Elks-driven community project. These \$4,000 grants are available to all Lodges.

Gratitude Grants

The Elks National Foundation helps Lodges serve their communities by offering Gratitude Grants of up to \$3,500.

Freedom Grants

The ENVSC helps Lodges meet the needs of today's veterans by funding the ENVSC's Freedom Grant. In 2022-23, Lodges can apply for a \$3,000 grant to hold an active project that directly serves veterans or a \$1,000 grant to hold a smaller project with more flexibility.

Spotlight Grants

The Elks National Foundation is helping Lodges encourage literacy or address veteran homelessness by offering Spotlight Grants of \$2,000.

Downloading and using online images on local lodge websites & social media

Background: In the past, local lodges and state associations have been using social media downloads from various sources and posting these materials on Local Lodge or State Association Websites. As a consequence, some materials have been posted that were unapproved and in other cases, inappropriate. For these and other reasons, we need to inform all lodges and state associations to immediately stop downloading and using materials from unapproved sites while promoting/advertising your lodge within your community.

As you know, branding Elks materials with personal names or companies are expressly prohibited irrespective of whether the creator is profiting from the product. Our organization also has a long history of working successfully with artists and producers to create approved marketing material that adheres to our brand standard. We have never allowed the artist to explicitly advertise themselves alongside our brand.

Result: Due to these issues, we need to inform everyone that groups co-opting BPOE branding will not be tolerated. Unofficial and unsanctioned social media organizations also have the potential to damage the reputation of our 154-yearold organization, perception, and legacy of Elks Lodges. This is because the content and messaging created through these channels do not have the oversight of the Grand Lodge. As outlined in the Elks USA Emblem Usage Guidelines "Allowing outside companies, organizations, and anybody else to use the Elks marks to endorse their products is strictly forbidden. As an organization, we strive to make these marks instantly recognizable as the symbols that represent the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. And as Elks members, we all need to work toward greater public recognition of who we are. Consistent use of our trademarks is one way we may do it. We will help our growth going forward if we all pitch in to adhere to the brand management guidelines."

To assist local lodges and state associations, Grand Lodge (GL) has hired a company (Gravis Tech) to assist in the development of new themes and materials for download to various Social Medial platforms. These have included Social Sharables (Social Shareables | Elks Lodge Membership & Marketing Guides found in the Membership Toolkit) which are available in Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and other platforms.

Gravis Tech, the GL authorized company, has developed additional materials for your use. These materials are found in the following links and defined below. Ultimately, the key to these new initiatives and clarification of social media posts is to develop a common and cohesive brand across all Elk's social media platforms that local lodges can use and that has been approved by GL, NOT by unapproved developers. At this time, the Elks sponsor several social media channels across a variety of platforms. We are utilizing the following official Grand Lodge social media channels to provide authoritative information. They include:

BPOE ELKS USA: www.bpoeelksusa.org is the OFFICIAL FB page for the Elks and every lodge and state association should be part of this group. It has significant and recent materials including press releases that all lodges and state associations can copy and paste on their local platforms.

ELKS Making A Difference: www.elks.org/makingadifference was created to promote your lodge by allowing lodges to share lodge accomplishments and photos in a variety of social media platforms.. Use the form found in the site to describe your event and submit a photo. Let us know who you helped and how many people participated. GL will then review and share your accomplishment on Official Grand Lodge Social Media pages.

Jolly Cork: www.facebook.com/bpoejollycork is the GL official membership and marketing mascot. This site is designed to create materials to promote what the Elks have always been noted for (Charity, Assisting Communities, etc.).

Again, and in summary, all lodges and state associations should be reviewing and using approved social media materials with appropriate Elks emblems, words and symbols. Your state association marketing chair should also be reviewing all lodge materials/posts before posting to ensure your local lodge is following appropriate Social Media guidelines.

Downloading and using online images on local lodge websites & social media

Oregon now has 6 lodges participating in the My Elks Mobile App (Salem, Keizer, Hood River, Gateway-Gresham, and Lebanon). All of these lodges are live within the app and members are encouraged to sign up for the app today! This app represents a major technological step forward in helping to promote our lodges and engage our members. The mobile app allows lodges to put information directly in the palm of members hands via their cellphone rather than members having to seek out information from multiple sources. The app pulls in pieces of your newsletter, website, and social media as well as Grand Lodge and State Association resources in an easy to use and convenient one stop location for members.

Studies have shown that over 90% of transactions today are conducted via mobile app and all demographics utilize smartphones and spend a significant amount of time on apps each month. My tapping into this tool to help promote lodges and engage members we can help our lodges be successful.

The app also offers lodges the ability for lodges to send notifications directly to members phones. These notifications can advertise events, nightly dinners, or even notify members of lodge closures or changed schedules. The app also includes a lodge locator that uses the GPS capability of the user's smartphone to show lodges within 50,000 meters of the users current location. This can be extremely useful to members when traveling who would like to find nearby lodges.

In addition, other fraternal organizations that have adopted the same app platform we are working with have seen increases in members retention as well as increases in revenues from increased participation.

Since Oregon did not get a chance to launch the app and show it off at our recent convention, we will be holding a zoom presentation to show off all of the features of the mobile app, discuss its benefits to members, benefits to lodges, and go over the cost and revenue generating capability of the app. This session will be held on July 10th at 2pm, members are required to register in advance for the session and once approved they will be sent the zoom information.


